







Senior physical fitness

Renovations to the new Senior Center. Lowering the cost of memeberships to the new YMCA facility.

Improvements to the animal shelter.

Real trash cans so bags of trash are not on the street. Paying our workers well so they feel valued. Streets and sidewalks, add more trees.

Improve street lighting in residential areas

Dedicated bike lanes, curb-protected from car traffic. More simply, bike racks outside local businesses.

Replacement of the playground on east Bedford Trails that Oncor took out after Snowmageddon. Location might have to be moved slightly, but if it's within a quarter mile, that would be helpful. Near the wooded picnic area a bit off the trail about 100 yards northeast might be ideal.

Add programs to support the poor or needy via food, shelter, or employment assistance

I would love to see some tennis courts, basketball, skating brought back to the boys ranch - something outdoors and free for people to enjoy beyond the awesome Y

I would use it to grant the citizen's memberships to the YMCA

Work to fill non-occupied retail/commercial spaces. Improve security and standards of apartment over-growth in the city. Lower runaway taxes and fees charged to homeowners in the city.

Improve infrastructure

25k isn't that much, but with the animosity towards the park, add picnic tables, benches maybe?

More greenbelts and walking trails. No more new construction until all empty buildings are used.

Crime is up dramatically, we need more police.

If legal, create a sinking fund that would be used to replace water and sewer systems and streets on a scheduled basis.

Improve streets, tear down eye sore houses, fund code inspectors to get folks to clean up trashy houses.

Free access to the new Boys Ranch. Grapevine doesn't charge its residents

I genuinely wish there was a public archery field in Bedford with at least 40 yard ranges. There are shooting ranges everywhere but space for archery is very limited in the county. If that is not feasible, I do wish all the playgrounds had sun shades so they are comfortable to use for a larger part of the year.

Our various volunteer groups provide countless hours to the community and save Bedford tens of thousands of dollars annually but are having to hold fund raisers to replace our ragged t-shirts. Please consider spending some money to replace shirts for CERT and even VIPS.

Clean up the parking lots of abandend buildings so they look less of an eye sore.

Safety

Lowering the cost of recreation center fees.

So many people nowadays are anti-vaccine and in light of the number of deadly diseases that have been brought under control by their use I'm at a loss as to why this is. I believe we need a good education program aimed at lower and middle income areas that will educate these people on how these medicines have improved people's health and quality of life over the years.

Create more opportunities to bring the community together. Classes? Programs? Collaborative opportunities? English or Language classes o resources?

Not sure this would fall under the parameters of how the ARPA funds are to be used but a comprehensive review and rewrite of city ordinances that would eliminate obsolete ordinances, bring others into alignment with state laws, if needed and maybe include changes that make it easier for citizens to feel like the "thumb of local government" isn't pressing down on them. This would include a comprehensive review of the fee structure and eliminating fees that are not assessed based on history or no other surrounding city assessed a similar fee.

More sidewalks especially on Simpson Terrace. Children walk in the street going to and from school and families with small children often walk and push strollers in the streets.

Some sort of artwork that could be placed throughout the city as an identifier for Bedford. Something fun and specific to Bedford.

Putting multiple benches at some of the parks (Central Park, New Boys Ranch, etc.). There is literally nowhere to sit while our children play. This doesn't qualify but could you bring a Sam's Club, H-E-B, or Central Market to Bedford please!

1) I would encourage tree-planting between sidewalks and streets along main arterials. Trees provide safety and a physical buffer from oncoming traffic. If there is no buffer between sidewalks and streets (i.e. Forest Ridge north of Bedford Road to Cheek-Sparger), people are less inclined to utilize existing sidewalks. Additionally, sidewalks in general encourage walkability, but these sidewalks need to be better-suited for pedestrians. 2) Expand our existing trail network (i.e. Linear trails) to connect to various City Parks. The fact that these are disconnected (mostly) doesn't make sense from a recreation standpoint.

Add Pickleball lines to tennis courts.

25,000 is not enough to plan any new changes ,it requires a lot more for improvement on roads, city activities to help lower our tax base,also help lower the cost to our senior citizens fees in the city.the cost of living is so great it could be used for coupons for senior citizens at local business.

Bedford Fun Walk/Run event in the Spring or Fall with t-shirts and prizes. A nature walk trail. Feed the homeless event.

Road repairs on Savannah/Gettysburg. Large trash bins like the recycling bins that can be wheeled to the curb the garbage crew will empty. More events like the Bedford Blues Fest wiith vendors and adult beverages.

Building a skate park! While \$25,00 won't build a skate park appropriate for Bedford, we could partner with local businesses (Bell Helicopter, State National, Harley Davidson, etc) and the Skate Park Project to help find the project. My son and I have done a lot of research and believe that we would need approximately \$100,000 to build an adequate skate park for Bedford. We also have done market research and if Bedford build a large, state of the art skatepark, we could attract people to Bedford from the entire Mid Cities area, and when people come to skate/ride, they also eat and shop. My son and I are happy to meet with someone from the city to share the research we have done.

Hold more community events, like a pizza-fest in one of the large shopping center parking lots.

PR campaigns for more multi-family zoning? Also maybe a study of irrigation at city parks and facilities; the dog park and soccer fields have a history of being over-watered though that might have improved recently. Similarly for Generations Park.

Ways in which kids could gather and enjoy time outside (FREE for the kids in order to be more inclusive)...at the Boys Ranchoutdoor basketball courts, a skate park, a dog park. Connecting bike trails. A small food truck park for weekly or monthly gatherings. Our new rec center is amazing but I'm disappointed about the fact that the FREE options were removed-tennis, bball, hockey. It was a very exclusive plan.

Have free days at the water park for kids who can't afford to go.

A dedicated Senior Place that is free and opened for all

Cover more electric boxes with art. More crosswalks with art. Repair back streets, sidewalks, etc

Perhaps events at the natural community intersections (invitations by school, park or recreation center location, near churches, or strip malls)) that people can walk to and see each other. \$5000.00 each location with representatives from city leaders and groups, reasonably priced or subsidized food, games and bounce houses operated by city.

Not citywide wifi! An app to report community concerns like grads as a high as a neighbors fence line, sprinklers on with freezing temps, dangerous suspicious neighbors or activity etc...

Roads are really rough, and in some cases inadequate for the amount of traffic.

I would like to see the beautification of Bedford commensurate with some of the surrounding areas such as main street, medians, intersections, etc.

More nature activities such as hiking trails. Anything to do with getting outdoors

Lights on the mail walking trail.

Revitalize Cheek-Sparger walking trail.

Improve streets and sidewalks, entice more businesses to move to Bedford (economic development).

Sun covers for play equipment in parks

Streets

I would probably expand some of the events held at Bedford. For example the Holi Festival at the Library last year. Attendance seemed great, but not enough things to do such as food trucks, hennas, etc. We enjoy Bedford events and would like to see those expanded. Second choice would be more support for fire and police in incentives for them, etc.

I would add seasonal flags or banners along Bedford Road, Central Drive and Forest Ridge to make Bedford feel more hometown like they do in Grapevine or small towns like Calvert, TX. I would add large planter pots with pretty flowers and park benches in front of store fronts to give the strip malls and stores a more hometown feel. Also, Paint murals representing Bedford on plain brick walls of buildings to show Bedford history.

One idea could be adding more decorative and inviting street lamps or signs on strategic streets. Another might be to apply it to more community events (similar to the Blues Festival, Art Festival or May concert series).

Fixing older damaged sidewalks. Fix damaged intersections(Hardwood and 121, Central and Bedford). Adding a few street lamps to older neighborhoods that have almost none?

Equip our police and fire departments with all needed resources to ensure they can do their jobs most efficiently and effectively.

TREES, shade, landscaping, and benches for Generations park.

Get rid of the apartments and turn them into condos. Home-owners bring more to the community. I understand that apartments bring in more property tax revenue but the residents are destroying the city. Southlake, Westlake and Colleyville thrive without apartments!

We are still missing sidewalks in areas of the city. It needs to be a a totally walkable city, especially for the kids around the schools.

Find someway to bring businesses and restaurants to Bedford.

I would love for the city of Bedford to build a toddler friendly park with slides at the East Trail End in the area that is outside the Oncor easement. There should be plenty of space to build a park similar to the one we had.

More bike safety and usage improvements. Signage for trails. On road information. etc.

Holiday picture spots and Christmas lights in Harris Ryals Park.

Get the Vaxmobile to have a shot Saturday @Meadow Park Athletic Park parking lot.

improve sidewalks, bike paths.

Future-proof infrastructure like wastewater facilities, fire and rescue, etc.

Purchase any needed equipment for police and fire.

A majority loves Christmas and flock to Grapevine as Christmas Capitol of Texas. Bedford seems to cater to specific groups—liquor stores, gun collectors, etc. We need a niche appealing to the majority. It could be a safe small "hometown" area appealing to all ages. Maybe an area that includes different types of specialty restaurants—Italian, Greek, Mexican, Indian, German, etc. with specialty shops within walking distance (as in Main Street, Grapevine) with the idea being to park, eat, shop, and walk in a scenic area without having to get back into the car until time to go home! If there is going to be live music, it should be in an enclosed area as not all music appeals to all and some types could keep some away. Maybe also add a small theatre showing films appropriate to kids on one side and older appropriate movies on the other side. In these upside down times we live in, how refreshing it would be to spend some safe fun time as they do in small home towns!

Install a Slip and Fly Water Slide with tables and chairs around it so people can watch the fun. Totally unique concept! Watch the videos. It will make you smile!

Continuing road and sidewalk improvements.

Replace water pipes in some of the older residential areas.

Improve the Bedford linear park (trail) with more amenities like benches, water, etc. Sorry we removed some of the playground equipment as well.

Give it all to HEB so they will open a store in Bedford

Tennis courts, access to Generations Park from Lakeview Dr. (like we used to have), self-defense classes for citizens, parenting classes

Update poles or make then solor powered on main streets. Central, Harwood, west park.

Some way to provide for more cleaning of trash on frontage roads. Clean burms (sp?) are important to attract visitors. Unfortunately due to health reasons ideas such as group contests (Boy Scout group, clubs, etc) are not viable for getting things picked up

The pool lift at the Roy Savage Pool needs updating. This would make the pool more accessible to residents with limited mobility.

I and many of my neighbors were very disappointed to see the unnecessary destruction of the East End Trails playground off of Hastings. I know there was some issue with an Oncor easement, but that's a large area and I feel the city could have done more to push back. Especially since the entire Meadow Creek Park area seems to exist in that same easement with no problems. Replacing the playground in that area would be a huge boost. Improving the landscaping along the greenbelt trail could also be nice.

I honestly don't know. I would say police and fire.

Open community Food pantry or closet that residents complacent food in for neighbors.

What a waste. Millions of dollars allocated for no reason. This is the reason why I have so much money stolen from me in a tax system that I have no real representation for. Fix parks and streets

After the young man's presentation at the council meeting last night, a skate park needs to be considered. Keeping the parks, updated and accessible to all is important. Additional community festivals would be good for a sense of inclusion for all.

Adding more recreational activities to the Bedford Boys Ranch. Plant more trees for shade as well for summer use

Yield to turn on industrial and Bedford rd. Update street lights on major roads and neighborhoods

Improvement to any area that appears rundown.

So many ideas! Bike lanes, public art - including infrastructure/artsy intersections, ensuring public infrastructure is up to par, training and development for staff - y'all have an amazing team! Collabs with local nonprofits, AARP Livable Communities, etc

Lease the land from HEBISD behind Meadowbrook park and turn it into a public facility. Outdoor music venue? Endless possibilities.

Police and Fire Departments

More code enforcement officers. Police officers stationed at school crossings.

Widening Cheek-Sparger Rd.

More lighting along the jogging trails near Cummings and Murphy

Food truck park, subsidize boys ranch memberships for residents, traffic light timing research, loud vehicle enforcement.

Remove membership fee to the Generations Park YMCA.

More sensitive sensors at traffic lights to detect when a car or especially a motorcycle is waiting at the red light. Numerous times I had to wait at the southbound Murphy/Harwood light through several cycles before I simply decide it is not detecting me and carefully proceed through the intersection. Mine is not a light bike. It is a large Harley and I am tired of the non working sensors

General Health and safety of our city for all. Especially Crack down on Apartment standards to improve living and safety of those living in apartments. To rid our city of the drugs that seem to inhabit many of the lower income apartments.

I would give all of it to the library.

Right off hand I would like to see Murphy Dr. improved to remove the significant dips on each side of the roadway that are at each manhole. This is at least between Cummings and Harwood. Another significant need would be to add low level lighting along the Bedford trails between Woodpark Lane and Forrest Ridge. This trail is very dark and dangerous when the sun goes down, which is early much of the year. This lighting could be timed if necessary. Capp Smith park in Watagua has an excellent model for what I have in mind for this trail. A third consideration is a little larger and that would be the addition of a community roller skating rink. Since Skatetown in Grapevine closed there is not another rink in the area that can serve those youth and families that like to skate but cannot afford to ice skate regularly. Roller rinks provide a safe haven for some in the at risk youth population. Thank you

Many of our streets and sidewalks are in terrible condition. Don't think \$25,000 is enough to fix them or really to do much of anything.

lower water/sewage prices

Seeing that all streets have proper painting directions and crosswalks.

More funding to the library for staff to help with programs and services would greatly benefit the community. You're one of the only cities that has a library open on Sundays. Providing this service to the public greatly benefits the community at large and putting more funding into things like that can help Bedford's community grow stronger.

Have street sweepers go down residential neighborhoods to improve appearance of our community and keep our drains and waterways clear of debris. NOT city offices and parks. Those are already being maintained.

To the fire and police department.

Turn area by dog parks and baseball fields on Harwood into a nature area or fully into a usable park. Programs/incentives to draw businesses to Bedford and to help current businesses update storefronts. more frequent running of streetsweepers. Institute an annual large trash pickup

I would love to see more artwork on the linear trails. Talented high school and Jr. High students could provide the artwork. Cool cultural project and low cost!

Give back to local businesses and ensure that they stay in Bedford

Please consider partnering with HEB ISD to improve parks next to schools. For instance, Harris Ryals Park has extremely poor drainage and causes significant problems for Spring Garden Elementary when it rains. The grounds are often flooded and muddy near the sidewalks next to the building, and the drain has caused significant erosion. Further, please consider procuring the vacant YMCA to provide more parking for both Harris Ryals Park and Spring Garden Elementary. This would help alleviate traffic congestion tremendously.

Playgrounds/parks for the children with benches & shade.

Continue to host community involvement events like the blues festivals and various other celebrations. Use the funds to improve them further or help promote them more so more residents join the event. Additionally, any further expansion to the library of things options and catalog would be great!

Better safer sidewalk infrastructure through the city. Too many sidewalks just end irrationally and resume a block or so later.

A festival to replace the Barbeque and Blues festival, like a concert and carnival. More food pantry type locations/ options for at risk youth

Pave the crumbling streets— Bedford road, greentree lane other residential streets in poor condition. I deliver meals on wheels in HEB area. Bedford streets are by FAR the shabbiest. It's embarrassing to have friends come visit from other towns

More running/walking trails & paths

Assistance to Sam all business and households, investments in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure.

Buy weed and feed for the grass at the boys ranch. Improve the grass so people can actually sit on the grass without weeds and insects for a picnic.

Improvements to the dog park. Bigger park, a splash pad like in grapevine, dog wash stations More service workers to help clean up the streets and remove trash from the creekbeds

Plant TREES (preferably evergreen native varieties) in our medians and public areas to clean our air, provide fresh oxygen + many other environmental benefits.

Build tennis courts for Boys Ranch or somewhere in BEDFORD. Sadly, Bedford currently has no public tennis courts.

Food banks for under privileged families all year long

July 4th and Labor Day celebrations

Poured-in-place rubber playground surfaces. Sport courts (basketball, tennis/pickle ball, etc) at Stormie Jones and other parks.

I do not know the cost of this but i think all students should be provided free breakfast and lunches no child should be turned away from a meal because lack of funds. I also think their should be some form of (Bedford not Tarrant County) community outreach programs for citizens that are short on food and or bill relief programs. We also have an increase of homeless citizens that need to be taken care of. Why can't we invest in some of the vacant buildings and help those citizens get back on their feet. Bedford is a wonderful community but we are failing in taking care of these situations.

The south end of Central Drive, between Schumac and Pipeline needs more speed signs, flashing yellow lights that alert drivers to the speed change and maybe a speed detection sign as well. People drive way too fast through that area.

Repair our streets and infrastructure. Get rid of drug and prostitutes in the hotel on the corner of Hwy 121 & Harwood (and anywhere else in the community). Help stop gun violence by eliminating or at least reducing the root cause of why or how this violence exists. I think the city is doing a great job on my other interests.

I would use that money to build a community garden in Bedford. A place to grow produce of all kinds and also build a type of building next to it that has classes available to teach the residents on how to make their own garden at home and grow what types of produce they would like to have whether they live in a house or apartment. Food is on the rise and if we can help the community with a simple garden they can have some food year round and won't have to starve.

Street improvements, shade structures for GP, rubber mats for playground at GP
