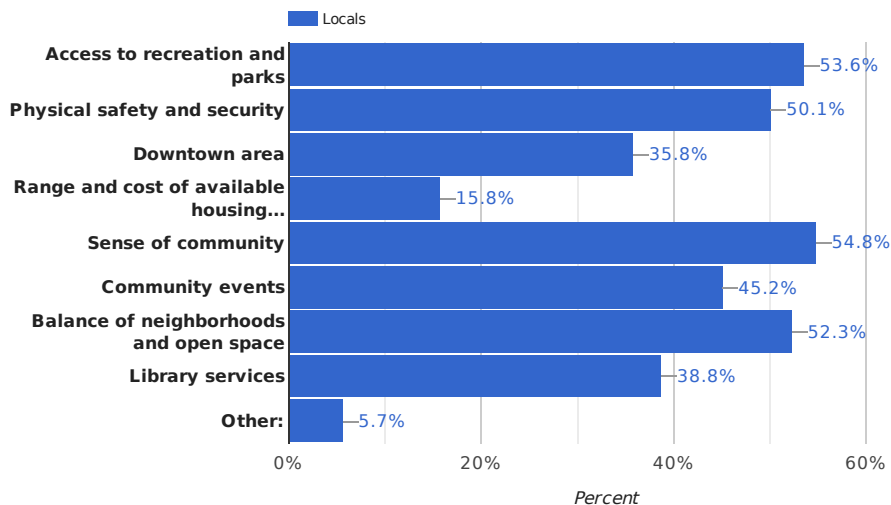

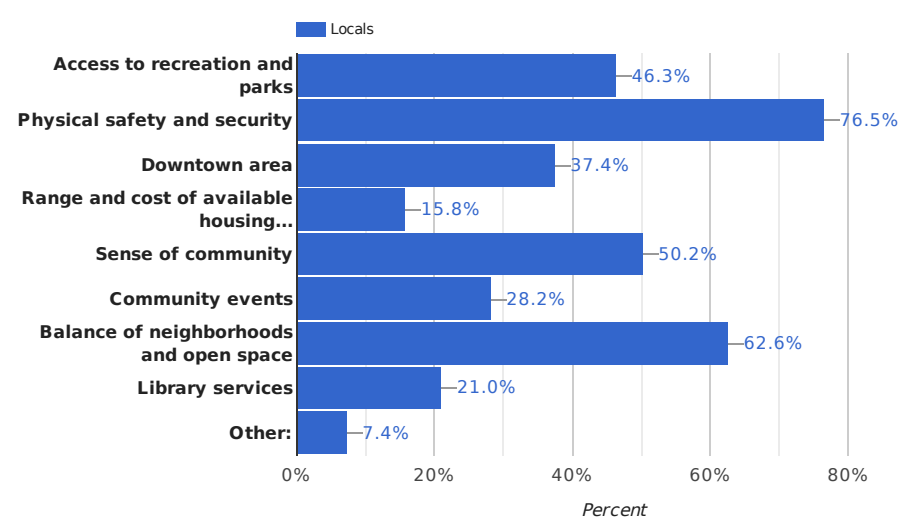

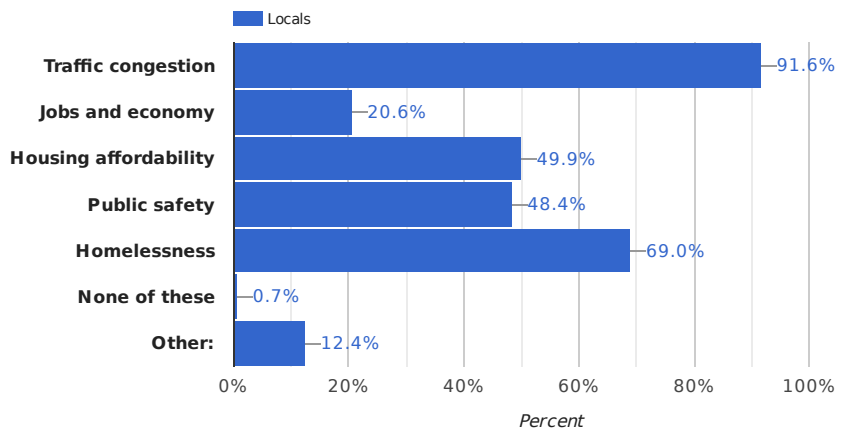

Ideas such as adding color to store fronts, and perhaps finding a suitable surface to paint a mural on the south end of town. Hire an ADA expert to design access and estimate cost for making the Carnegie Library accessible and then open it up to a Service Club (like Lincon Rotary) to fund and complete.

Make some of the park projects happen. Way too few parks for the people.

word "affordable" in connection with \$400K residences. Build graduated projects- some units \$285k 2 bedrooms, intermixed with \$245k 600 sf units, and adjacent to twice as ;;many pared down(very modest,maybe without a patio at all, and no view- 215K apartments, and alongside the storage uit portion of the complex, 400 square foot studios that the city would own (means could never be resold for profit) and rent for \$600/month (for a person just then getting 'their own place". I also think dormitories should be an option for those in whatever transition-- to rent from a company who provides cleaning, oversight, and option for hot food service brought in. These would be available for only 75 days. The clear message is that an occupant is expected to secure longer-term housing asap. Suitable for divorcing persons, persons "trying out a new job here from far away", and persons coming to terms with problems.

Finish the projects already promised including new park next to Leaman

I would be able to fix approximately one block of bad roads in the older areas.

Codify "No Camping" and "No Storage" ordinances for City property of all types (parks, open space, etc.) and enforce those rules. Use Code Compliance processes to get private property owners to stop allowing encampments and/or storage on their property,

provide services for assisting homeless

Open libraries full time. Digital events billboard at the entrance to Lincoln on I-65.

Add hours to the library

Install more flashing stop signs.

Depends on the project. I would not "sign a blank check".

Advertising campaign for downtown events

Lincoln needs a more inviting & fun downtown, with better restaurants and shopping.

Unfortunately, \$10,000 doesn't get you much these days, however if I were going to spend money to make Lincoln better. I would increase the number of parks with open fields for sports teams to practice. I would also look into the ways to help offset the increasing cost of adult sport leagues.

Enhance and maintain biking and pedestrian trails

That's such a small amount it's hard to say. Maybe a traffic study (a small one) but it's no secret traffic will be a huge issue as the area grows.

A really clever communications campaign that inspires pride in Lincoln and promotes a well-organized system of community service and volunteer activities directed toward improving the quality of life across the town.

Charity poker tournament

Add to library offerings. Either increasing subscription services or preferably increasing hours of operation.

Add more parks and recreation activities for adults ages 25 - 45. There are children, teens, 55+, but not much for the middle ground.

Perhaps some art or sculptures to decorate local parks or downtown made by local artists. They could perhaps donate their time/skills and money would be for materials. Please no graffiti or overly colorful murals.....something classier.

I've lived in 12 Bridges for almost 8 years and the maintenance of trees, bushes, is sad to say the least. We need soil added to trail areas that have holes deep as a foot, soil and bark added to support trees and bushes. Please consider, not having it is bringing our property values south!

\$5K on parks and programs for kids to keep them from the dark side (aka crime). \$5K on a plan to be able to drive "licensed" golf carts on city streets (not just Lincoln Hills)

(1) Subsidies or grants for businesses to be part of (offer their services to) afterschool programs - everything from writing workshops and arts activities to science exploration to sports camps. (2) Host a downtown street fair/art show/market where a street is closed to traffic and pedestrians can walk several blocks and visit brick and mortar merchants as well as "pop ups" in the street. (3) Create a "outreach" curriculum for the history of Lincoln/Whitney/Rocklin/Wheatland area that can mesh with elementary school curriculums for local field trips and hands on experiences.

We need CC&R's to actually mean something; code enforcement to create neighborhood programs to help residents with keeping up property values.

Add more police patrols, too many people are not following the law. Keep the open spaces open and try to stop trespassing.

Get rid of the bums living in Markham Ravine

A weekly sweep of homeless ... Especially around auburn ravine

Additional community events through the library

Break into ten \$ 1,000 awards ... one per month ... that is then given to the individual who submits the best actionable idea to improve Lincoln. This idea could be one that costs nothing to one that costs up to \$ x where x is one that the city would seriously be willing to spend (e.g. \$ 25K ? \$ 50K ?). Of course, I believe this idea of mine should be considered the 1st winner ... and then I would like to donate this to the TBHS Class of 2024, who will be the 1st ever graduating class for TBHS (as Lincoln High School celebrates their amazing 117th). Thank you.

Barriers to prevent homeless encampments. Signage to prevent unauthorized camping.

This is an unrealistic question, \$10,000 would do absolutely nothing!

\$10, 000 is not enough. \$10 million on Traffic signals at Nicholas and Lakeside, Nicholas and Nelson, and at Joiner Pkwy and Moore Road.

More cops on the street... if you're not safe in public, you have nothing. Likely not a city activity, but would also like to see more family outdoor events, i.e.; craft fairs, movie nights, parades, etc. with better advertising. We've been here over 6 years and always find out about activities after the events from others who have lived here for many years. I'm sure we'll get the hang of it, but would be great to have a central resource, at least for the 'big' events.

Public pickle ball courts

Pickle ball courts, area for kids and teens

Remove the No right turn on red signs from Joiner and Groveland and Groveland and Ferrari.

Lincoln MUST have more sit down restaurants (not fast food or pizza) serving affordable meals breakfast, lunch and dinner. Lincoln MUST have more grocery stores like Nugget and Trader Joe's. More shopping for household good would be helpful.

Improve bike lanes and walking trails.

I would make a great dog park that had two sides, one for small dogs and one for big dogs.

10 K won't even repair a sidewalk. Put my \$10,000.00 toward widening and paving Industrial Ave!

Make Downtown more walkable

More bike trails and walking paths

Continue developing walking / bike paths.

Public Transportation. Something similar to Sacramento Regional Transit's "neighborhood ride" program using (van style) buses to link residential neighborhoods with shopping, doctors offices or other businesses.

Safety in the parks and creeks. I'd love to be able to take my kids to the creek but I'm afraid they will step on a needle or come across feces that could make them sick. Eradicating homelessness is a huge idea, I know, but making sure the public spaces are safe for all paying residents is a top priority.

Being a lead/moderator on the Nextdoor Lincoln site, I see a lot of issues with people concerned about the homeless situation. I don't have a lot of realistic enough ideas but I know that others are much more up to date on what is working in other cities/towns.

bus tickets for homeless to somewhere else.

Provide stipends to high school students, or veterans experiencing homelessness etc. to pick up trash, help maintain the parks or empty poop dog receptacles in the parks.

Planting California native plants on city owned areas to aid pollinators and beautiful the city. As well as including the name of plants to educate the public on drought tolerate native planting Increasing urban shade in public gathering areas for the summer. I.e sun sails that could be removed for the winter months. The urban heat island effect will be one of the biggest challenges to urban life. Playgrounds that don't have any covers will not be usable during warm days and age faster. More bike racks in Downtown, in safe trafficked areas so riders will feel confident they can leave their bike there while they go about downtown. A bus service to take people into downtown during events. Downtown will never flourish is it only accessible via car.

Clean up homeless camps

Place park benches as seating areas at various locations (maybe at parks and along trails) in the city to promote an atmosphere of peace and comfort in Lincoln.

A study of traffic, parking, etc. for the future.

What about having fun activity days involving small local businesses. Perhaps gifting/helping fund open houses at their locations. For example, we've always enjoyed going to the airport in the summer. What if there was an event near the BookCellar that was partially funded with this money (perhaps a free ad and help spreading the word via the chamber). Hope this idea makes sense. \$150-\$200 per small business could help 50+ small businesses. Otherwise, I am not sure. More shade at local parks - but not sure how expensive/cost effective that is.

I would give it to the Lincoln Community Foundation to use for those that have a particular critical need.

Take better care of the medians and setbacks in the City. The vegetation is overgrown on Bella Breeze drive where it appears the city is responsible for portion (it's the City's portion that appears to be not being addressed). This is an eyesore. Otherwise, I am not, \$10k is so very little for a project.

Increase bike/NEV lanes and lower speed limits along Joiner pkwy

We are building more homes without more parks, police, grocery or gas stations. We are quickly outgrowing our infrastructure

Make homelessness a thing of the past

Re-open the Carnegie Library for downtown/Old Town/what I call Village 0.

When planning a project such as street resurfacing the city should improve communication with residents in affected neighborhoods. This current project is very disorganized in regard to communication.

We have a large elder population and a growing ADA population (Just look at how fast WPUSD special education department is stretched). We need to be serving both of these communities better. Getting this population out into the community, safely and often will keep them thriving and their loved ones happy and satisfied with the Lincoln community.

More shopping options in Lincoln so I don't have to go to Roseville or Rocklin as often

Less stop signs at every corner where they are not needed, and more stop signs at corners where there are needed

As Lincoln will mostly likely grow from a small town to a bigger city like Rocklin, keep it a small town feel, building off of what drives families to the area. Parks, activities, safe places for recreation and amenities. Get some pickleball courts, real legitimate ones, be at the front of what people want to do, not after. That's what draws people in. Continue promoting local, and the infrastructure will be key. Can we pave some of the roads that are filled with pot holes. This helps people see we care about our community.

Limit building of new homes.

Let more stores and food eateries come in. We have so much housing and most people cannot get all their needs met in Lincoln. I spend thousands in Roseville/Rocklin that could stay here. I would love to give my tax dollars to my city.

I don't profess to have any grand solution to the homeless situation, but it has gotten to the point my wife and I avoid certain places of business and areas because we are uncomfortable with the homeless folks approaching us and situating themselves in front of certain establishments. This means the shop owners are missing out on our expenditures.

Less housing projects and less building. We don't have enough schools/city employees and fire/police currently. Removing all the open spaces is depressing and taking away the rural feel of Lincoln. Keep Lincoln small and rural.

New housing should require more spacing between houses. Too close together is an eyesore to the community

Hire a capable, qualified Economic Development Director with strong business connections. Hire a part time Public Information Officer for the City to help explain the General Plan, traffic and parking issues, public safety funding through sales tax and many other issues that are not well understood by residents as evidenced on social media almost daily.

Convincing people to clean up their yards from old cars to junk.

Thank you for using Flash vote. Noticing how fast life changes (GPT, for example!) do consider that people have a job in one Lincoln, a spouse who may be in Elk Grove most days caring for grandma, and young 2 kids with a former partner who lives in Placerville. This is NOT RARE even now, let alone in 2035.

Stip allowing developers to come in and build when the roads and Schools are on adequate

More pedestrian access to and around downtown

We need public pickleball courts available in twelve bridges. Roseville has plans to build a whole complex and Rocklin has plans for several dedicated pickleball courts. Come on Lincoln, build some in twelve bridges!

More police presence in Twelve Bridges, particularly Eastridge and surrounds.

Widening Hwy 65.

Take action to reduce flood-risk.

Slow growth over time. Fill the empty business buildings you have before you build new ones

Partner with Roseville electric.

Don't do anything to lessen our sense of our small town community

Balance the budget and take the airport elephant off the city's back.

Sidewalks throughout downtown and more mixed zoning to allow for a thriving downtown area to extend beyond just Main St.

Focus on quality of life issues for residents, not the latest political trendy topic. Politics just divides communities, but having good parks, downtown businesses , and events unite people.

Traffic is growing and i see no plans to address it.

Create a biking and pedestrian trail under Highway 65 connecting the two segments of Moore Road.

Don't allow illegal camping in the ravine area, make sure anyone there is using trash bins, make sure human waster is not going in the watershed.

Downtown needs a significant upgrade. The lack of quality shops and restaurants is appalling.

Slowly clean up or find developers for the underdeveloped areas of downtown before allowing future expansion on the edges of town.

We don't need hotels and gas stations within 5 miles of schools.

Comparing Lincoln to Roseville and Rocklin, I am glad to see all the open space and walking paths instead of wall to wall houses. Keep this up as well as parks in all the villages so residents do not need to drive to a park.

How about a nice welcome to Lincoln sign? Also, either move the rodeo or develop a nice fascade that celebrates the rodeo

Must get the large truck traffic away from down town to allow it to thrive. Right now noise, congested. lack of parking.

Property values in existing neighborhoods are going downhill. We need to come together in neighborhoods to help those who can't do it themselves and apply pressure to those who just don't want to... yards full of waist high weeds are a fire danger; broken down/crashed vehicles in the driveways for years, outlandish exterior house colors or peeling paint, portable basketball hoops on sidewalks and unmaintained common landscaped areas and trash is blight; and neglected dogs barking day and night all bring down the value of property and brings down our sense of community. I would love if there was a city-lead program that we can join to help our neighbors.

Improve proactive communications. Build a culture of community-focused mindset and communication within city staff (e.g. people should always be thinking - how is what I'm doing going to impact our residents ... and leverage that to decide what & when to share additional information with the community).

Increase funding for code enforcement.

Approve permits for commercial construction more toward the Northern side of the City.

I love living in Lincoln, it's beautiful, safe and people here are very friendly and helpful to others in need. I do wish the City would put a hold on some of the commercial building going on here. Traffic is beginning to resemble San Jose way too much and the available parking is not sufficient to accomodate more cars.

Over building will have a negative impact.

Not sure if this is something the City can do anything about but literally there is no cell service in our area (Elliott homes off of Twelve Bridges). Everyone has complained to various phone companies and City departments. Our neighborhood is in a valley, just low enough that cell towers that exist can't reach us. New cell towers that are in the works won't reach us either. It's somewhat of a line of sight issue, so unless there is one down here, we are dependent upon wifi. So... when the electricity goes out, we have no emergency communication (all 'house' phones out here are VoIP, same problem. This is really a bad place to live if there is a major or semi-major catastrophe.

Concentrate on increasing the size of the police department

Parks, picnic areas, bbq area. It would be wonderful to have a nice Aquatic area other than McBean. Maybe some neighborhood parks could have swimming pools?

The only suggestion I can think of is to get more restaurants, chain type restaurants, in the area so people are staying in Lincoln to go out to dinner dates etc.

Improve downtown area and traffic flow

More traffic enforcement. Too many stop sign and red light runners.

Limit residential growth to more thoughtfully designed communities to prevent another "sea of repetitive subdivisions " like West Roseville (and even parts of Lincoln) now has.

Bring historic district together. Attract home buys after these post war homes. Nevada City does this well.

Ensuring that law enforcement is fully funded and treated with respect so they came come to work with good morale is also a priority to me.

None that I can think of currently.

A lot of money is directed out of Lincoln to surrounding communities...enhancing parks systems, restaurants/businesses in the Twelve Bridges area specifically will help keep the money in the town.

Less congested housing, better traffic flow

Fill vacant lots downtown with business that will draw more people there.

Stop prioritizing cars over people. Prioritize pedestrians over cars and people over parking. Create third places that people can walk to safely. Prioritize integrating nature and using sustainable practices.i.e. native plants and non-invasives planted in city controlled areas. Invest in public art that gives a sense of place Ban gas powered leaf blowers (leaf blowers are extremely air polluting and annoying)

More police officers to keep us safe

Continue revamping the downtown area, like old Folsom downtown area.

Traffic congestion/flow in Lincoln is a problem now and will probably become worse. Work on a possible solution, especially near the newer, higher density neighborhoods and around schools.

Spread the word more (and help people not have a stigma about counseling) - spread the word about free counseling services and mental health care services that churches in the area provide and that the Lighthouse probably provides to help prevent/slow down drug abuse and homelessness issues, that may be a growing problem.

All these new developments with insufficient green space. No parks or recreation facilities. No bike lanes. Terrible planning choices. Lincoln can do better.

Not that Lincoln alone can address this but Highway 49 the traffic - this is keeping businesses and visitors from coming to Lincoln. We have so very few dining and entertainment option in Lincoln that we spend most of our money and time outside the City. We'd love to do more in our community.

We need some good dinner restaurants.

Continued work to get unhoused into better living conditions and to turn the creek area into community paths & picnic area.

Maintain common space landscaping. More entertainment businesses.

Divide up the MASSIVE Beerman's Building (since we will be owning it again soon) so many different businesses can exist. The space is TOO BIG for one business/owner/concept

Build low income apartments

Fix the garbage issues at joiner park.

Improve entrances (make more attractive, widen bridges) to downtown from the south side Lincoln Blvd and McBean Parkway.

Stop uncontrolled growth. Stop uncontrolled housing development.

Make Lincoln a walking town with one way streets so people can stroll from a parking lot to downtown.

There have been repeated complaints on Next Door about problems with the railroad crossing at Lincoln Blvd/Ferrari Ranch. Already the awful death of that mother and her child seriously injured. And since then, several other instances where the crossing arms did not operate properly or come down as they should when a train was approaching. Is anyone in the city aware of this, working to get this fixed?

Well, Thunder Valley just spent over \$100 million on their new The Venue and the City of Lincoln gets revenue from that. I just attended my first concert there with my sister who came from Eureka. Everything was spectacular EXCEPT the drive from

Lincoln down Industrial Avenue! This has to be one of the worst roads in the city (possibly dangerous!) leading to this gem of a destination and quite frankly it is a disgrace to the city. It needs to be re-paved!

More advertisement of activities in Lincoln and businesses in Lincoln.

Do something about the homeless situation. Have no recommendation on how, but it needs to be addressed.

Stop building high density housing.. build more low density.

Keeping open space a priority. Nice having it within developments, Lincoln Hills being an example. Require developers to leave more open space and/or parks.

Continue to improve the "quality" of Businesses in Downtown. It needs to be a place attractive to the residents. Again, improve the parking problem.

TBHS parking area is not large enough. Library parking is being used by students, teachers, parents etc. so much that patrons cannot get into library to return books, attend programs, or just visit the library.

Additional parking for the TBHS so library parking remains available. Relocate the recycle bins to an alternate location like the park and ride lot. Explore more affordable intermediate parking like a gravel lot for the sports fields.

Stop building houses
