







(339 responses by)






Q2 How would you rate the overall quality of Newton parks (maintained by the City) and recreational facilities (maintained by the Newton Recreation Commission)?





I greatly appreciate our parks service. I love our combination of Big Parks (Athletic, Centennial) and small (Washington, Ash, Roosevelt). I think Thermian could use some love, however.

You already have a good balance of small and large parks.

Trees are needed at centennial.

Sculpture would add a lot even if it is someone playing baseball. A play feature with chimes for children and adults. A larger than life chess set with moveable pieces. Native plants over finicky annuals needing lots of water.

The bike trail by Sand Creek Station golf course needs to be connected to the bike trail by Athletic Park/Sand Creek. This would flow more bike riders into the Athletic Park area and increase usage.

It might be time to begin replacing playground play structures. Have noticed cracks in plastic slides and ride on items.

Having law enforcement make the parks a regular part of their patrol during high usage times and during night time routes to check for vandalism & break ins.

The current mix of big parks (Centennial and Athletic) at the ends of the Sand Creek Trail along with smaller neighborhood parks is nice. The trail is awesome and promptly maintained. Roosevelt Park could use something (pickleball and a parking lot). Veazy Park has great potential with its location along the trail and the creek.

I like the idea of small neighborhood parks with playground equipment. I don't think we need "green space" defined as just empty, grassy areas (no trees, park benches, etc) in neighborhoods.

Although not directly related to recreation in parks, increasing trees and shade in parking lots would make those areas more inviting for people walking and biking around town, going shopping. I greatly appreciate the parks and green spaces we do have in Newton, although most of my exercise comes from biking and walking around town- so I like to imagine all of the town as a park

So many of Newton's parks are just vacant lots with ball fields. There should be at least one park with landscaping and art that is a pleasant place to walk, meet friends, sit and enjoy being outside.

I appreciate our parks! How about a kids splash park North of the railroad tracks? Maybe Roosevelt Park?

Lights at Railer field!!!!!

Taking all shade out at some playgrounds rends them practically unusable. Some of these had trees years ago and now there is no shade. Plastic and sun are not friends to little people. This might be the reason some of the parks are not used much.

I would love to see a natural playground built in Newton. Google "splash pad walk through at lake bylessby" and there is a short video of that park to serve as an example. The idea is more dirt, sand, wood, stones, and water to play with instead of the traditional plastic playground equipement. I would also like to see fences around playgrounds. The park can be stressful for parents with multiple kids, especially if you have a runner and a baby. This is especially important for autistic children that elope (run off) and have no sense of danger. A fence would help keep kids safe and help parents enjoy the park as well.

I believe the number of parks is sufficient at this time. Keeping all available parks maintained and play equipment in great shape is my preference.
