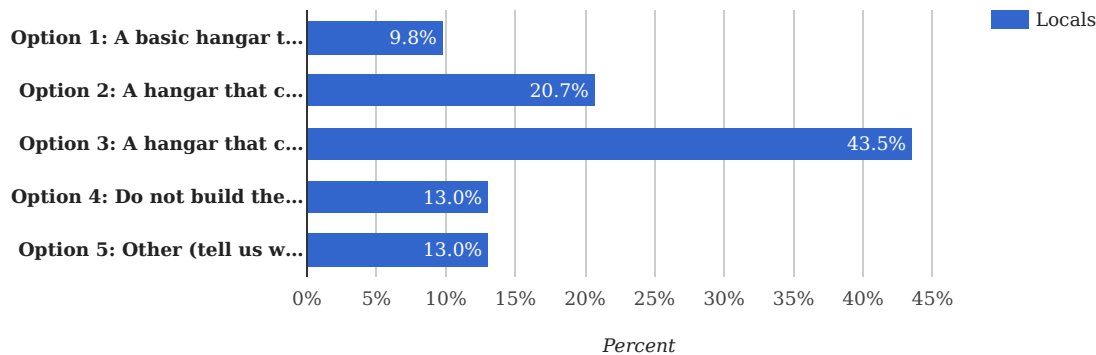

Option 1: A basic hangar that can house small to large sized business aircraft with warming and de-icing abilities. Can host up to 222 people for events, but would require portable toilets, and doesn't include a kitchen space for event food prep. Estimated Price is \$3 million	9.8% (9)
Option 2: A hangar that can house small to large business aircraft with warming and de-icing abilities and that also includes amenities for year-round community events such as: audio and visual, moveable floors and walls, tables and chairs, stage/performance space and restrooms for 200 people. Does not include kitchen facilities. Estimated Price is \$6 million	20.7% (19)
Option 3: A hangar that can house small to large business aircraft with warming and de-icing abilities, plus in-floor heating, a backup generator and restroom facilities for up to 600 people, more year round community spaces and office/meeting	43.5% (40)

All large Truckee Chamber events (Awards dinner, Business Expo, Job Fairs, community input meetings. Hotels will be able to use for group/special events that require more than their 1000 sq ft rooms have (greater revenue in TOT, TBID, sales tax for shops & restaurants where these folks will go afterwards), Will provide a place regardless of weather (huge variable in this area).

Fundraising events, community club meetings (i.e., Rotary), annual community gatherings

Conference meetings, art events, music events, trade shows

There is very limited meeting space in our community yet we have many events. Resort at Squaw Creek and the Ritz (way too expensive) are the only ones that can handle large meetings, group and special events. I see fundraisers, annual award dinners, meetings etc. as uses for a multi-use hangar facility.

The community arts center on church street is in high demand, but often events are held up by plays that block out months at a time.

Art shows, event venue, meetings, lectures and presentations, community meetings

Maker space. Science space for schools.

Enough space already exists in the community. No need to build the facility.

Indoor sports competitions, not weather affected. Weddings, Large meetings, music events, etc.

Events/fundraisers, Concerts, Winter Farmer's Market

My vote for hangar options was not recorded. It would not let me register a vote. It just took me to this page and would not let me go back. If I was given the chance to vote I would vote for option 3 - the largest hangar.

We need more community space for events and for permanent activities

Weddings, live performances (Theater, plays, dance, music, etc.), Private events, Workshops, seminars,

Test Run

Multi-use with ability to host large events such as weddings, corporate parties, and summit conventions.

Airshow, Charity fundraisers

Aircraft de-icing, business idea incubator spaces, airport and non-profit functions and fundraisers, emergency operations center.

indoor air show exhibits; memorials; fundraisers; community meetings; corporate convention meeting space

major fund raising events. lectures and educational presentations and training, cost of facility for nonprofits will be a big question, use conflicts during bad weather situations, must include table and chairs on site so nonprofit will not have to rent, full kitchen in 6 million dollar plan might be considered to keep the cost to build a bit lower, include a air museum in part of the plan

consider building a separate building for the community use(s) in the future. Don't think that a combined facilities makes economic sense and does not meet the needs of the wider community. The community may be larger than the non-profit stakeholders.
