


Q1 Think about the computer (such as a laptop) you use primarily at home.





Q2 In the last 12 months, which of the following problems have you had in Watertown, if any? (Choose all that apply)


Good options for fast download speeds via cable (RCN & Comcast), no FiOS for symmetrical up/down.





All good ideas, hard to prioritize them.

Allow more competition - Verizon FIOS isn't in all parts of town so we are restricted to Comcast or RCN

As a retired software engineer, I know how to do everything I need or want to do on the internet and I have good access at home.

As far as I know Comcast is the only provider available to me as a Watertown resident . Can there be other companies so I have a choice for internet and cable services ?

As it stands I can get high-speed internet at home for about \$25/month from 3 carriers (RCN/Astound, Comcast/Xfinity, and T-Mobile). I expect this is better than just about anywhere I can think of. This town supports remote workers in many technology-related businesses around the world. I don't think there's a problem. But sure, low-income people who can't afford access probably should have it. I'd make the carriers pay for that as a condition of doing business here.

At present there are only two internet providers in my building at 55 Waverley, I wish we had more choices besides Comcast and RCN...I shouldn't have to pay \$115 a month just for 10 local channels plus internet, and that's including the \$30 govt. credit which won't last forever....

Community run fiber. Higher speeds and lower costs!

Competition among ISPs is crucial to prevent them from gouging Watertown residents and the town government.

Consider offering internet through the town as opposed to private carriers such as Comcast. Residents would still pay for it but the cost would likely be reduced.

Create a municipal internet service provider

Doesn't seem to be much choice of internet providers. Would be good to compare who is in this area and offers good service at reasonable price.

Encourage fiber adoption. Communities with significantly smaller populations that are much further from Boston have fiber internet yet Watertown remains significantly underdeveloped.

Fix dead spots around east side

FlashVote will mostly reach people who are already comfortable online. Please ask WPS families and housing authority and senior center constituencies.

Free wifi for around watertown & free wifi for low income folks.

Generally, Watertown seems to be doing a good job.

Get rid of Comcast's monopoly.

Get the legislature to do something to regulate these monopolies

Get wifi for the whole town. Help low income people pay for cell phone service.

Give us real choice on providers

Have more providers such as Verizon available.

Have we considered a municipal high speed internet offering? I know some towns (Concord, I think?) have public fiber optic. If laying fiber is an impediment, could consider 5G-based service? The Calyx Institute, a non-profit dedicated to educating folks about digital privacy and security, offers paying members a free high-speed internet service delivered via a t-mobile hotspot device. Help seniors get smart phones that are large enough for them to see the icons. Then help them to use it to the library is Senior Center.

I am not sure how to be clearer that having FiOS available would make a lot of sense. And I do not understand why it is not available here. One Verizon employee told me it was because when they were negotiating a contract with Watertown, someone tried to get special considerations. Is that accurate?

I appreciate the idea to not dig up the streets/roads, but it would be so nice to get access to Fios. Both me and my wife work from home and we are dependent upon reliable and fast internet to do our jobs

I believe that computer literacy and internet access are important for equity.

I cannot stress enough how frustrating the mobile coverage (or lack of coverage) is in Watertown. In my home (and the blocks surrounding me) I am unable to make or receive any calls at all unless I have WiFi and a phone that has enabled WiFi calling. This is a safety concern (from a 911 perspective) and also just crazy to be in such a populated city with little to no cellular coverage. It is so frustrating for me and have been complaining for years to Verizon that the lack of service here is so bad. We really need improvements in this space, particularly with more and more people abandoning their home phones for cell phones. We need to improve this at baseline first because internet outages happen all the time and if there are emergencies (like a fire) that cuts off electricity and no mobile coverage people are unable to call 911.

I don't think it's a good idea to provide public internet in parks, buildings, or any other place unless you can encrypt it and make it secure. It would be a waste of money because I would NEVER encourage someone to log on to a public wifi. (People can steal your data and give you viruses through public WIFI.)

I had hope that 5G would have enabled a drop in internet cost in Watertown. Is there still hope?

I had no idea Watertown even had public wifi. Making this known and widespread would be cool. Also holding internet companies accountable for poor service. Additionally, Watertown should ban the use of paper advertisements from internet companies. These immediately go in the trash and are a complete waste of resources. People have the internet they do because they got a deal. And at least my house, we get a lot of adds for internet we already have.

I hate that Verizon has a monopoly in my building on Pleasant St. not understanding how internet service areas are defined.

I have the money and the skills so \*!\* do not need help with my computer systems. Because you cannot get ahead in this society without good computer resources, I fully support assuring that those who cannot afford these services are assisted by our government. Do we have a one-child, one-laptop program?

I know my mother would benefit from some of those things in the last question - she's in her mid-70's - and I'm sure other folks in her age bracket (in addition to others) would also find those helpful.

I live just a couple of blocks from cell towers in two opposite directions, yet I only get one bar and many dropped calls. This necessitates keeping a landline - a waste of money in my opinion

I support any and all ways we can support members of our community and think it's a worthy investment of tax dollars.

I support maintaining and increasing ISP and mobile provider competition, as well as improved infrastructure, such as buried cable, more cell towers, etc. I don't see much value in education on internet and tech in Watertown.

I think getting access for those who don't have it is top priority, especially for families with school-aged children who need to use internet/devices for their education.

I think there are already direct federal subsidies for people w/ economic barriers to access tech. But - there really needs to be an increase in online access for Seniors/Disabilities/Low income/ESL (esp Public Housing & isolated independent) for support in Voting & Online Applications (Employment/Services etc). Place public computers w/ internet in every housing building, promote use w/ guidance for people whom transportation is a barrier.

I wish there were more choices for internet provider options. Right now I have Comcast/Infinity

I would like to see government efforts and money primarily go to improving equity related to online access.

I'm glad to see Watertown making an effort to ensure that everyone in our community has internet access and skills.

I'm worried that people like me can answer these questions because we have online facilities easy to reach and have competence using them. How will other people show that they need service, public availability, lessons, etc if they don't have

access, or good access, now? This is a key problem with this Flash Vote. Doesn't make sense for most issues that require participation in/viewing of meetings, emails, documents. I hope other means of testing/questioning the population are in order.

If there are major carriers (e.g. fios) that don't serve Watertown it would be great to get those. I am not sure about what would most meet the needs of lower income and less internet savvy residents, but would like us to ask them and take their lead.

Internet drops frequently

It would be awesome to have greater access to Internet companies that didn't cost so much. Between Internet and cable, we pay \$150/month and we don't watch TV!! We're always searching for other ways to get basic news stations without going thru RCN.

It would be great to have more options to select an internet service provider.

It would be nice to have access to fiber optic services in Watertown

It's great that the city is considering how to improve connectivity for our residents!

Lack of access is so catastrophic today in terms of public services and employment , we really need to be laser focused on closing that gap before we work toward improvements at a broader scale

Less regulations, lower the cost of internet services especially to seniors.

Look into partnering with local universities to acquire their decommissioned laptops then repurpose them for low-income members of the community. I work in IT at Harvard Business School, and I know the computers we decommission are still plenty fine for several more years. We send most to a third-party recycling facility, but it would be really great if we could set aside some for local communities. I'd guess that some of the technicians would volunteer their time to prepare the computers (wipe drives, install Windows, etc.) for non-HBS use. If I recall correctly, Microsoft has licensing options for nonprofits or NGOs to help with this.

Make FIOS available

Many low income folks only have their cell phone to do all of there business. Trying to do more complicated things are difficult to do this way. Phone apps are not as good in many cases. Helping any folks whether low income, elderly or just uninitiated to have computer literacy and access is key for these folks. Any access to this is important. Having help at these sites available for these folks is great too. Make more available and let people know it is available.

More options for cable and internet. xfinity and RCN are not up to par. Thanks!!

Provide ongoing support services for internet users at the Housing Authority and Senior Center, as well as at the library. Provide regular information classes for scam avoidance at these locations also.

Provide tablets or equivalent to Watertown school students.

Residential internet service in Watertown is too slow and too expensive, particularly upload bandwidth. Numerous economic opportunities would open up if residents had higher up link speeds available to them.

Some towns are starting to provide their own internet services. The benefits of being in control of and offering an alternative to for profit companies seems valuable. It would provide another option which would serve the people of watertown, allow for

control of pricing, availability, and access.

Stop using proprietary networks like Facebook to make announcements and organize.

Teaming up with the senior services to help internet/technology feel less intimidating and more accessible.

Thanks for asking. Please publish/disseminate survey results, along with any follow-on decisions.

The East end of Watertown is a fiber desert! The lack of FTTH service in Watertown is a huge disadvantage compared to surrounding communities as more folks work from home and use higher-bandwidth applications for leisure. I know that the Legislature has significantly handicapped municipal broadband networks due to lobbying from incumbent providers, but this should not prevent the city from looking into either the feasibility of such a network or partnering with an existing provider to subsidize or smooth permitting for the construction of the network and provide vouchers for low-income residents to get connected.

The avalanche of information available online is a great resource for so many things. That said, we've got to teach media literacy and introduce some skepticism and sophistication into how people process information they get online. The business model for much of our current information ecosystem is to drive engagement by making people angry and scared. Our civil society and democracy won't survive unless we get better.

The internet should be a utility - it's a communication tool that is necessary for everyday, much like landline phone once were.

There are limited options only through the large media corps. It would be nice to have choices in the smaller local business option for internet/cable. Also please do not put high output wifi signals, or more 5G, dishes or antennas into our neighborhoods. TY!

There is limited mobile service for Verizon near my house. It has been a problem (near North Beacon and Charles River). It extends to the new Arsenal complex. I've called and been told it is exactly on the edge of where the range would max out. A new tower is needed. It would be great if it could be part of the new structures in the Arsenal. Also wifi should be made widely available to the community for free at public spaces

Townwide internet service. Elderly aunt lives in Shrewsbury and has option for internet thru town. It is easy to call and get a live IT person to troubleshoot problems. Important for people who aren't comfortable online. Also, offer multi-lingual classes.

Upstream bandwidth from RCN is awful, and we need it more than ever if working from home. A municipal fiber deployment would allow residents to have a fast, stable, inexpensive connection that we control and isn't behind a profit motive.

Use the modern technical tools like text and social media to improve city services...e.g. more processes online and elimination of winter parking ban as you can use ad hoc notices via multiple platforms. Look at Somerville for this.

Using Zoom is increasingly important. Anything that helps residents to use it would be a real service.

Very upset the FIOS is not available!

Watertown needs better access and choice to lower priced internet for all. Comcast and RCN are too large companies that have us cornered.

We live near Victory Field/DPW/Whitney Hill and some friends/family have trouble with cell data at our house. We have T-Mobile and have no problems, but others (Verizon, primarily) have trouble.

We need to improve the aging infrastructure for internet in private homes in Watertown. It has a lot of problems and I don't think it was designed to bear the load that it currently supports with so many people working from home.

What barriers does the phone company claim are preventing better internet service? Are these real barriers, or just their way around rules working for the public good?

When I moved from Somerville I was surprised to see my portion of Watertown was just outside of RCN coverage area, giving me just one ISP option. It would be great to have multiple options, and it would be great also to have gig speed+ internet as an option. I would love if the town itself created an ISP but I know that's an unreasonable hope ©

Why not have fast, affordable municipal broadband?

Watertown's website needs a radically improved search function.

For years I have been subjected to price gouging by Comcast because they were the only broadband provider at my address. Things are better now that rcn offers service here, but the ridiculous price hikes every year or two, and intransparent pricing and packaging are awful. I would welcome a public option from the town, even if it was more expensive than the promotional "first year" pricing in the private sector, in return for price stability and reliability. The quality of service for me offered by Comcast and rcn is poor for the cost.

I don't think the town should be in the business of helping residents with what is essentially a utility at this point. What would be far more helpful is better options for obtaining broadband service. The cable companies largely have a monopoly, and rates continue to increase while the service provided remains the same for the most part.

If you're thinking about free, public wifi, it should be available citywide.

More and more services are inaccessible to older adults who don't have computers or computer skills - eg., the RMV!

Take care and provide more services for the middle class tax payers ,we are the only reason you j ave a job

Teach internet safety for browsing and for securing data, etc.

There should be public wifi available to all residents and more options for internet service. Why does Watertown not have FIOS?
